Approval has been given for 215949 Pte K C JOHNSON to live out from 18 Mar 66 to 26 Mar 66, both dates inclusive.

133. SECURITY CLASSIFICATION

1. The Australian security classification "Confidential" has been re-defined as follows:-

Confidential - Information and material the unauthorised disclosure of which would be prejudicial to the interest of the nation.

2. Consequent on the re-definition of the classification, "Confidential" a new term "In Confidence" has been introduced. This term is to be used for those matters which require to be safe-guarded in order to prevent administrative embarrassment or unwarranted injury to an individual. Examples of "In Confidence" markings are:-

"Staff In Confidence" for subject matter concerning staff.

"Medical In Confidence" for subject matter concerning medical records, reports, etc.

"Commercial In Confidence" for subject matter, the disclosure of which would prejudice a private commercial interest, provided the national interest is not involved.

"In Confidence" the general marking used on such subjects which previously were covered by the wording in the old definition of CONFIDENTIAL "administrative embarrassment or unwarranted injury to an individual".

3. "In Confidence" is not a security classification. However, in view of the nature of the information contained in the documents, falling within this category documents bearing this marking are to be protected from perusal by unauthorised persons and are usually to be transmitted in double envelopes.

4. "Personal" is a privacy marking and is to be used if document is to be seen only by a named individual or person occupying a named appointment. The name or appointment of the addressee of a "Personal" document should, therefore, appear both on the document and its covering envelope. Such documents are to be given the same protection as provided for "In Confidence" documents.

5. The marking "Private" is not to be used on documents concerning official matters.

6. "In Confidence" markings are not normally used in combination with a security classification. The handling marking "In Confidence" is to be typed in capitals or stamped on the top right hand corner of the first page of the document. In signal messages "In Confidence" is to be the first two groups of the message. This handling marking is only to be used on documents or papers graded UNCLASSIFIED or RESTRICTED.

7. The new arrangements are to be introduced immediately in respect of new material and action to re-grade existing material in accordance with the new definitions, is to be undertaken as soon as possible.

134. ARMY DRIVING LICENCES

135. ADMITTANCE TO LOEWEN THEATRE

- a. Refer current intelligence and situation reports.
- b. 4 RAR is relieving 1/10 GR in the DAU area on 26 Apr 66.

2. MISSION

4 RAR Sig Pl and 589 Sig Tp are to provide communications for 4 RAR with effect from the change of command by 4 RAR from 1/10 GR on 26 Apr 66.

3. EXECUTION

- a. General Outline - The primary means of communication will be by radio.
- b. Radio - The following nets are to be operated by 4 RAR.
 - (1) 4 RAR Command Net VHF
4 RAR Administrative Net HF
Company Command Nets; on order by Company Commanders.
 - (2) Command Net VHF - The net will remain open at all times. Sub-stations will only close down with the prior approval of the forward control station.
 - (a) "C" type radio will be used from forward bases.
 - (b) "A" type radios will be used by specialist platoons and patrols when operating on this net.
 - (c) A rebroadcast station is to be located at KROKONG.
 - (d) Radio Diagram at Annex A1.



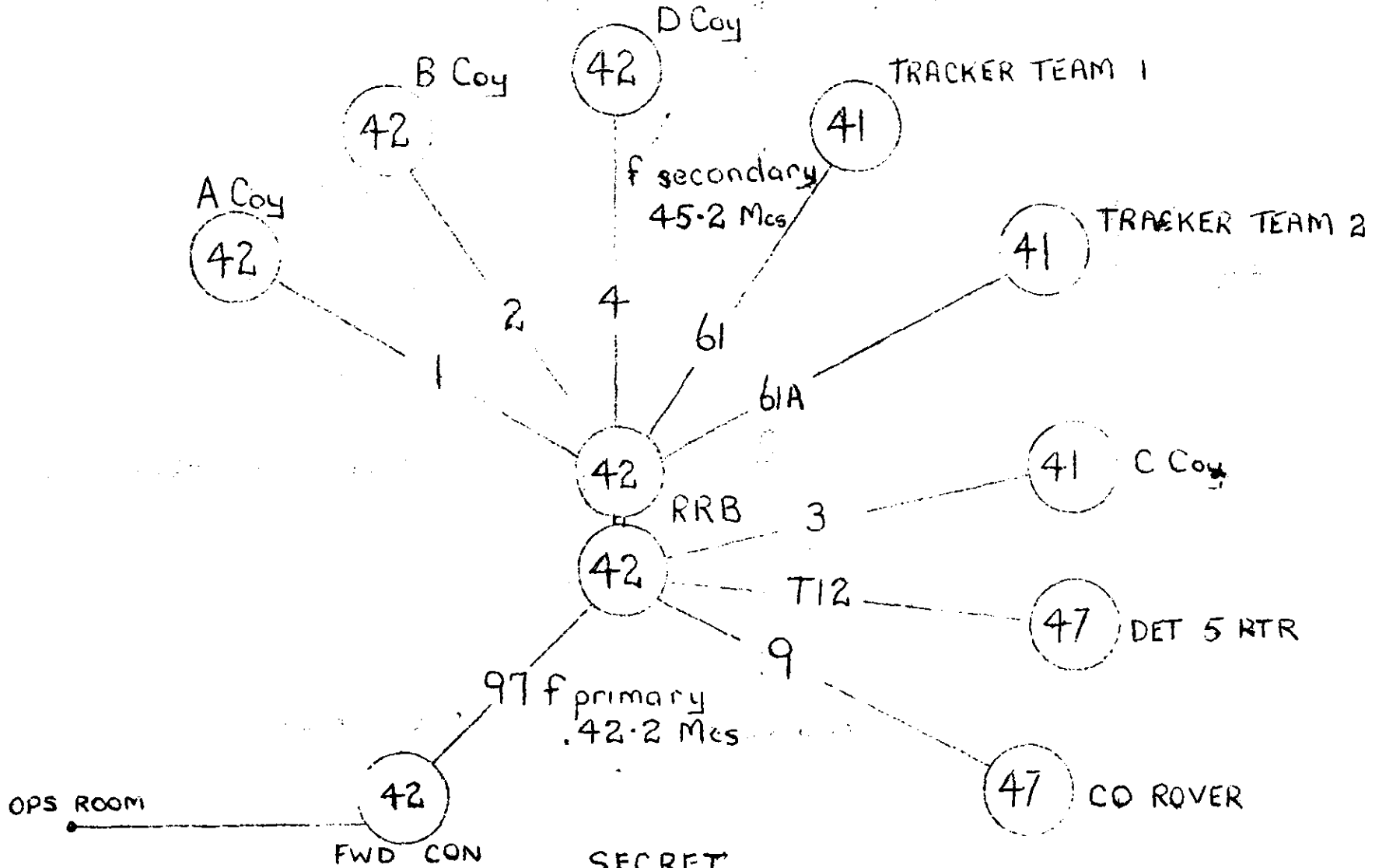

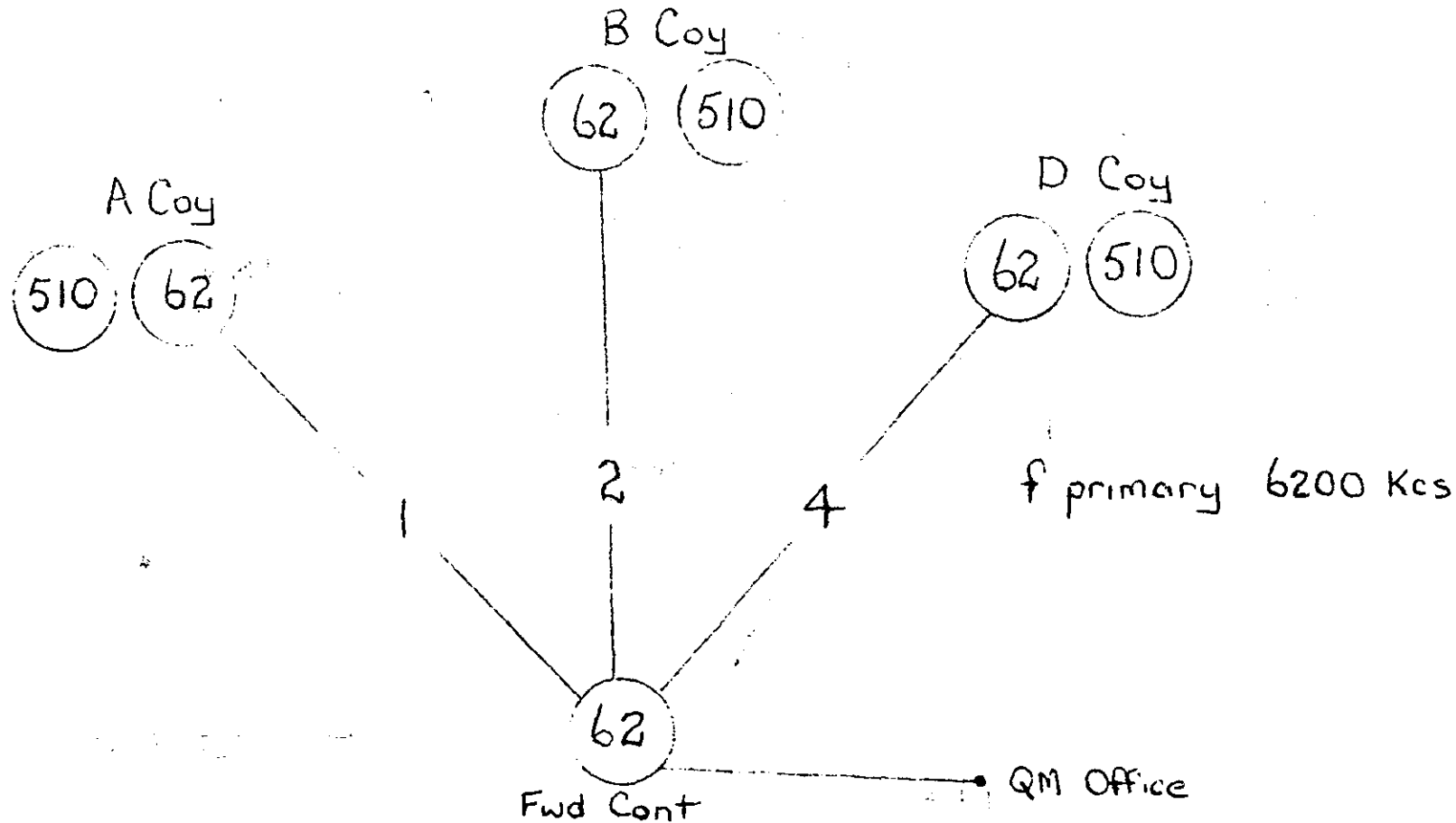

138. HOME SAVINGS GRANT SCHEME

1. The Commonwealth Government is offering married persons aged less than 36 years a grant of \$A2 for every \$A6 saved for the first home they own. The savings must be made over a period, and held in an approved form. The maximum grant to a married couple, or a husband or wife if only one is eligible, is \$500 on savings of \$A1500 or more. Smaller grants are, however, payable on lesser amounts.
2. The grant is a tax-free gift; it is not a loan.
3. The aim of the Scheme is to encourage young people to save, both before and after they are married, for the first home they own after marriage. The grant is a reward for this saving, and will assist young people to own and establish a home.
4. Service in this theatre offers excellent opportunities for saving during the member's tour.
5. Further enquires to be made through Company Orderly Rooms.

139. FOREIGN AWARDS

1. In view of the increasing interest in the award of Orders, Decorations and Medals to Australian Servicemen from other countries and the increasing requests for permission to wear these foreign awards it should be understood that foreign awards may not be accepted or worn without the Sovereign's permission. Normally no British citizen in the service of the Crown may accept or wear a foreign decoration. Australia conforms to the British practice.
2. Representations have been submitted that the present Regulations concerning the acceptance and wearing of foreign awards should be made more flexible to permit the acceptance of foreign awards under certain circumstances. Should these representations be successful, the amended Regulation will be notified.

140. OVERNIGHT EXPENSES OF DEPENDANTS ATTENDING SPECIALIST APPOINTMENTS

1. Approval has been given for the reimbursement of reasonable accommodation and meal costs, in cases where a dependant of a member is referred by a service medical officer to a specialist, and the appointment involved an overnight stay away from home. This is subject to evidence of expenditure being produced, and the concurrence of the Treasury Representative, Singapore being obtained.
2. Members concerned will be required to contribute an amount equivalent to half the amount for food, for the member and his wife as shown in the scale of living costs.
3. Where a parent accompanies a child or children referred to a specialist involving an overnight stay, the member's contribution will be as described in paragraph 2 above, plus the additional element for the child or children concerned.
4. AHQ Administrative Instruction 6/64 will be amended in due course.

- a. Time, Date, Place of occurrence.
- b. Description of occurrence.
- c. Regimental particulars of personnel involved. Where dependants are concerned, the regimental particulars of the soldier are to be included.
- d. Civilaction taken.

3. Follow up should be taken by units to advise whether court action is taken or intended and the result of such action.

4. Headquarters Australian Army Force is to notify the following:

- a. Army Headquarters, Canberra.
- b. The appropriate Australian High Commission in Malaysia or Singapore.

5. This report should not be confused with the NOTICAS procedure as described in MBI 38 - 1.
