 - (c) Heads of services not below the rank of Lieutenant Colonel.
 - (d) Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - (e) Unit commanders.
 - (f) Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

- 6. Both original and duplicate copies will consist of:-

 - (c) Narrative (AF C2118).
 - (d) Annexes as shown in the Index.
- 7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes will be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer will be included.

Wherever possible the beginning and end of the period will be clearly stated. Notwithstanding the above, on the outbreak of global war all units and formations which are not at the time submitting these reports will start compiling them with effect from M day and will thereafter render them in accordance with paragraphs 15 and 16.

448. DISCIPLINE - SMIGGLING

- 1. Article 166 of the A my Pensions Warrant states that any person who is discharged for misconduct or dismissed from the service with ignominy may lose the whole of his service gratuity.

10SS OF IDENTITY CARDS

- 1. Attention of all Sub units is drawn to Kulaya Area Routine Order 247/65.
- 2. With the security situation that exists in Malaysia at present, the loss of Identity Cards is very serious.
- 3. Sub units should remind all personnel of the need for special care of ID Cards and that any such loss will be treated a prevalent offence.

450. CONSERVANCY - MARRIED QUARTERS

- 1. Rubbish is being allowed to accumulate in the garden and surrounds of many married quarters. This is unsightly; allows mosquitos to breed; and may interfere with grass cutting contracts.
- 2. Householders are responsible for clearing their own garden refuse by burning or other means.
- 3. Sub units are to ensure that this responsibility is made known to all married families.

451. SECURITY OF INFORMATION - ORDER OF BATTLE

- 1. All ranks are warned to be on their guard against correspondence from persons calling themselves "Students of military history" or "military unit stamp collectors" and so on.
- 2. This correspondence usually takes the form of a covering letter with stamped, addressed envelopes attached. The recipient is asked to put the unit stamp on the envelopes and post them.
- 3. Any person complying with these requests is committing a breach of security by giving order or battle information to persons not authorised to receive it.
- 4. The correct way of dealing with requests of this kind is for the recimeent to report it to unit HQ.

7. CLERILGE OF PLESENGERS ON MOTOR CYCLES/MOTOR SCOOTERS

- 1. Observations carried out over the last two months show that extremely dangerous practices by motor cycle/motor scooter riders are on the increase in Terendak Camp Area.
- 2. These are:
 - a. The carriage of more than one passenger other than the rider. This implies the carriage of several reall children at the same time.
 - b. The carriage of a passenger or large bulky article between the rider and his handle bars. This is particularly notificable with scooters where riders stand a child between themselves and the handle bars.
 - c. Carriage of a pfillion passenger while the rider is a holder of a provisional licence only.
- 3. Ill these practices are highly dangerous because in the first two instances the rider cannot exercise proper control over his machine and in the third case the rider is not sufficiently experienced to carry a passenger with safety.
 - 4. In all examples given the practices are illegal under the Walaysian Road Traffic Ordinance 1958.
 - 5. The GMP have been instructed that, in future, all such offenders are to be reported.
 - 6. Sub units are to bring this order to the attention of all ranks and farilies.

8. DISCIPLINE - W. TER SKIING

- 1. The attention of all Sub-units is drawn to Annex to Garrison Standing Orders which lays down the rules for water skiing.
- 2. These orders are being disregarded in some cases which could lead to serious accidents.

15. POLYGAMOUS HARRIAGES

Extract from Adjutant General's Branch RQ 47/65.

- 1. Members the Edvised that a polygamous marriage, or a potentially polygamous marriage, contracted by a serviceman serving abroad are not recognised by the Commonwealth of Australia. Consequently such a marriage if contracted would not be valid for the purposes of marriage allowance etc., and the wife would have difficulty in obtaining an entry permit into Australia.
- 2. Any member who has contracted such a marriage is advised to have the marriage soleminzed under the Commonwealth darriage Act 1961.
- Marriage according to the Moslem Law is regarded as potentially polygenous.

16. BURGLARIES

1. At this time of the year there is a great increase in the number and sudacity of burglaries. All ranks living both in and out of Terendak are advised to institute the greatest security of personal effects possible. In addition they are advised to have all these effects insured against theft. The approximate rate of \$7:50 per \$1000 cover would be a small sum to safeguard against subsequent financial difficulties.

17. DISCIPLINE

Extracts from Adjutant General's Branch RO 50/65 "Charge and Offence Reports".

- 1. The JAG has ruled (JAG 47/65) that in drawing of charges of absence without leave the additional particulars showing the time absent as a total of days, hours, and minutes, should be omitted.
- 2. In AAF A4 in the section provided for names of witnesses, there should be no mention of the word "Documentary" in cases where the evidence is in the form of a statement, e.g. a RMT report, the name otc. of the person making the statement should be shown as the witness.
- 3. Units should ensure that AAF A4 are correctly distributed to:

21. ANTI-MITE CERTIFICATES

Before commencing any exarcise or moving out for an overnight stay in the field, each Company will present to Bn HQ a certificate stating that anti-miting of clothing had been carried out.

22. MAKING OF WILL BY MEMBERS ON FULL TIME DUTY

Reference: MBI 212 - 3.

- 1. Every member on full time duty who is eligible to do so is advised either to take a valid Will or satisfy himself that he has already made a valid Will.
- 2. A valid WILL can be made by any number who has reached the age of 21 years. A member under that age is NOT eligible to make a WILL except:
 - a. Under TASMANIAN law which permits a married male minor 19 years of age and a married female minor 18 years of age to do so;
 - b. In time of war, when, in certain circumstances differing in the various States and Territories, a minor may execute a valid Will;
 - c. In time of peace, after having been warned for embarkation for, or whilst sering in :
 - (1) an active service area; or
 - (2) a distributed area, or isolated post where he may be involved in military operations.

23. POWER OF ATTORNEY OF WIVES

- In the event of Australian Troops serving in Malak. being required to leave the FEDER TION at short notice on operations, some members may not be able to re-arrange their personal affairs within the time available prior to departure.
- 2. A wife has only very limited power to act as agent for her husband unless specifically authorised by him. Thus, even a married member could find difficulty where a hire purchase agreement must be adjusted or there is a motor vehicle or other property to be returned to AUSTALLIA.
- 3. In these cases where individuals consider that they may have trouble settling personal matters before embarkation, they may desire to execute a Power of Attorney.
- 4. To assist those numbers, a form of Power of Attorney has been prepared. Copies are available from Bn HQ Orderly Room. The

choice of an ATTOMNEY and execution of a Power in his favour are purely personal matters for the individual concerned.

- 5. It is most undesirable that any number of the Australian Military Forces should be appointed to act as holder of Power of Attorney. Should there be such an appointment, it could ultimately prove embarrasing to the Arty if the Attorney failed to carry out his functions in a way that pleased the donor. It could also become a major administrative com itment. Wives can be appointed holder of a Power of Attorney for their husband.
- 6. Accordingly it must be emphasised to all ranks that the form of Pow r of Attorney is made available for any member to use or refrain from using as he sees fit, and this is the beginning and the end of army responsibility in the matter.

25. ACTION TO BE TAKED BY PARENTS IN RELATION TO CHILDREN BORN IN SLAGAPORE/

Notification of Birth

- 1. When a child is born to the wife of an Australian Serviceman in a British/Military Hospital, the hospital registers the birth of the child.
- The certificate of Registration of a birth is NOT a Birth Certificate. A Birth Certificate may be obtained by presenting the Certificate of Registration of a Birth to the local Registrar of Births and Deaths accompanied by the necessary fee.

Registration of a Child as an Australian Citizen

- 3. A child of an Australian Serviceman who is born in MALYLY SING PORE is, at birth, automatically a British Subject but not an AUSTRALLIN CITIZEN.
- To register a child born in MILYL/SING.PORE as an Australian Citizen then parents should complete two copies of an application form obtainale from the husband's unit and forward them through the unit to the Australian High Commission, 44 Ampang Road, KUAIA HUMPUR, together with the following:
 - a. Marriage Certificate.
 - b. Child's Birth Certificate.
 - c. Two (2) passport sized photographs (2" x 2½"), of each parent and the child to be registered.
 - d. Evidence of the Father's Australian Citizenship. Any of the following documents provide this evidence:
 - (1) Birth Certificate
 - (2) An extract of Entry
 - (3) Naturalization Certificate.
 - (4) Registration Certificate.
 - e. Mother's passport for endorsement

5. The application should be lodged as soon as possible after the birth of the child and in any case not later than six months after the date of birth.

Malaya Allowance

6. Immediately a child is born to an Australian Serviceman in Malaya/SINCAPORE, the member must notify his unit. On receipt of the certificate of birth, "Federation of Malaya Form A", the member will obtain a Malaysia Pay 3 Forms, "Variation of Malaysia Allowance Advice", and report with both documents to the unit prorepresentative. The unit pay representative will complete the form Malaysia Pay 3 and make the necessary adjustment to the member's pay and allowances. The certificate of Birth will be returned to the member after action by the unit pay representative.

26. DISCIPLINE - DRESS

- 1. Non-Regimental forms of dress, such as bare buff, socks rolled down over boots, PT shorts, no hats, are not permitted outside unit lines, except when troops are taking part in some form of unit training.
- 2. a. Hats are to be worn with uniform at all times when travelling in military and civilian vehicles.
 - b When travelling in uniform on intorcycles, scooters etc. uniform hats or crash helmets are to be worn at all times.
 - c. Sub units should encourage personnel to wear crash helmets at all times, when riding a motor cycle or scooter but particularly when doing so outside TERENDAK Camp.

27. TERENDAK COLF CLUB

- 1. The Terendak Golf Club is a private Club, built and maintained by members of the Club. Membership is open to all ranks of the Garrison.
- 2. Use of the Course and Club House is permitted only in accordance with the Consultation and Rules of the Club, and is restricted to fully paid up members of the Club.
- The Course is OUT OF BOUNDS to all ranks and dependants at all times except for the purpose of playing golf.

28. GARDEN REFUSE

- 1. Occupants of quarters are responsible for the disposal of their own garden refuse. The normal procedure for this would be by burning, and gardeners, when employed, should be instructed accordingly.
- 2. Small quantities of garden refuse can also normally be cleared by disposal in dustbins, but it should be understood that this refuse is NOT included in the garbage contract and large quantities are likely to be refused.

29. DRIVING OVER/PARKING OF VEHICLES AND PRI .. TE CARS ON GRASSED AREAS

- 1. Vehicles and private cars are not to be parked on grassed areas. This particularly applies to occupants of married quarters who are parking cars on grassed areas.
- 2. Considerably erosion of grassed areas has taken place through vehicles/cars driving over and parking on such areas.

 - (2) Quarters built on MDD (Army) land.
- b. The areas to be cut include all land, drain, verges, surrounds and rough ground lying adjacent to the quarters extending up to the land/land within the perimeter of each house. The land within the perimeter of a house is entirely the responsibility of the occupant.
- where no clear division is evident to indicate the lawn/land within the perimeter of the house, this is to be taken as the area of lawn/land inmediately adjacent to the house extending to the first natural obstacle such as a monsoon drain or hedge, or to a distance of twenty yards from the house, whichever is the lesser. Where cases of doubt exist the exact perimeter is to be defined by the Depot Officer, MPBW in consultation with MQI.
- d. The grass land within the perimeter of a house may be cut and paid for cut of public funds in cases where the house is left vacant for six weeks or more. In such cases the cut will normally be made inmediately prior to the turch-in of the new tenant.


