COMMANDERS DIARIES INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organisation and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

2. Entries will be made daily on AF C2118, each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties in the Field", Chapter 2, Section 7.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary will be made by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (see note 1)

5. A Commanders Diary will be made in duplicate by:—
 - (a) Commanders of all formations.
 - (b) Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a Brigadier or above.
 - (c) Heads of services not below the rank of Lieutenant Colonel.
 - (d) Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - (e) Unit commanders.
 - (f) Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

6. Both original and duplicate copies will consist of:—

- (a) Cover (AF C2119).
- (b) Index as printed on cover.
- (c) Narrative (AF C2118).
- (d) Annexes as shown in the Index.

7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes will be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer will be included.

8. The annexes will be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an Annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, the relevant papers should be grouped as annexes starting at B.

9. Documents concerned with future planning for operations will form Annex "Z", "TOP SECRET Supplementary Diary" of the formation. It will be prepared and disposed of as from the date of the document.

2. The Ministry of Defence or headquarters concerned will be responsible for instructing units to submit Commanders' Diaries where the conditions of the unit's employment make this necessary. Wherever possible the beginning and end of the period will be clearly stated. Notwithstanding the above, on the outbreak of global war all units and formations which are not at the time submitting these reports will start compiling them with effect from M day and will thereafter render them in accordance with paragraphs 15 and 16.

- 13. Description of contact: Ref Annex 'P'
 - a. The track 'X', at 934575, was checked at approx 1600 hours. Recent signs were sighted heading NORTH across the main ridge. An ambush was sited to cover this track running NORTH from the RAYA ridge, as it was anticipated the on, currently being followed by Spl, would move onto the RAYA ridge, using this track.
 - b. The on in fact, moved onto the RAYA ridge, 30 yds EAST of the ambush posn - the rear of the ambush. The en moved WEST along the main ridge track for approx 5 yds, checking the track. It is obvious the on had seen footprints of the ambush force. 4 en were initially seen. The pl comd at 'E' now could see 2 en, After approx a further 5 yds, the leading scout crouched onto his knees checking the ground and turning over leaves. No 2 was leaning over the leading scout's shoulder. The first two men looked around again, checking the area. The en advanced a further two or three paces, when the pl comd decided if fire was held any longer, the on may have spotted his ambush - NOT sighted for this direction - and break SOUTH into the jungle.
 - c. The action was triggered by a burst of approx ten rds AR 15, at a range of approx 18 yards. The first two men at 'A', were seen to fall, and remain motionless. It was assumed that the two men at 'J' facing EAST could still see the 3rd and 4th men. This assumption was later proved wrong, as the 3rd and 4th men were hidden from view by a large buttress tree ('T'). At this stage, only 4 en had been reported. It was only later on during the contact, that a 5th man was reported. After the initial bursts, the pl comd called to the two men at 'J' and asked what they could see. They replied that they could see NO movement to the front. Assuming that all the on had been killed in the initial burst of fire, the pl comd stood up, and was immediately fired on. The pl comd rapidly returned to the "prone lying" position. Fire was returned, and the en ordered to place down their weapons and surrender. The on replied with a burst of fire.

- h. 2Lt CHAMBERS plus 3 Sect, cleared through to the WEST and then re-organization was completed. Lt CURTIS performed the pl comd's duties, and 2Lt CHAMBERS carried out the duties of "Pl Sgt".
- j. First aid was administered to the two wounded, morphine being given to both, and stretcher poles cut. Simultaneously, Lt CURTIS passed back the details to OC C Coy on 2Lt CHAMBERS radio set, plus requests for casualty evacuation. The casualty evacuation then took place, with two sects carrying the wounded, 2Lt CHAMBERS remained behind with one sect to check the dead, and prepare the en bodies for movement. The contact site was then ambushed.
- k. The casualties left the scene of the contact at 1820 hrs. The pl comd dismissed the possibility of winching out the casualties, because of the country and vegetation. On route, Pte A. WISELY (RAMC) with a carrying party from 8pl, met the casualties, checked and redressed the casualties' wounds. Due to ruggedness of country, nature and conditions of casualties, and lack of man-power, casualties did not reach the heli-pad until 0058 hrs 16 Jun. Distance from contact to heli-pad was approx 1000 metres. Casualties were successfully evacuated by WHIRLWIND at 0225 hrs.

14. Details of immediate follow up: NIL.

15. Lessons Learned or Relearned:

- a. The enemy is not to be underestimated. No noise was heard from the two enemy who quietly occupied a position, behind the buttress tree. The first indication of their presence, was when they fired at Lt CURTIS. These two enemy also inflicted our two casualties. It is the unseen enemy that causes the damage.
- b. The Stretcher Bearers (RA Inf) who administered first aid, are to be complimented. Pte T. YOUNG who tended to Cpl LANG did a first class job. Without their expert handling, the casualties would have arrived at hospital without much hope of recovery. Unfortunately Pte RICHARDS has since died, but Cpl LANG's recovery, must be attributed to the first aid received at the scene of the contact.

16. CO's Comments:

- 1. Lt CURTIS and his nine men did well against a determined and brave enemy, approaching from an unexpected direction. The operation was complicated by a mixture of section and platoons.
- 2. The fifth enemy was not seen by anyone. He apparently left in haste during the initial contact. Signs of a hasty retreat down the steep slope were seen. A follow up was attempted next day, without result.
- 3. Pte R.R. ANDERSON is to be commended for his part in this operation.
- 4. The evacuation of casualties, was done at night, in very difficult country. The two stretcher bearers, Pte YOUNG and Pte JOHNSON, and a medical orderly Pte A WISELY (RAMC) did very well, and should be congratulated. Without their care, both casualties may have died.

- d. The two men at 'J' were ordered to move EAST along the SOUTHERN spur, to locate the position of the en who fired. They reported one man still in position behind the buttress tree. The LMG group 'G', plus another two rifle men 'F', were then deployed on the SOUTHERN side of the track, SOUTH and SW of the en. The two men at 'H' joined the pl cond and his signaller, at 'E'. The deployment at this stage, were 6 men on the SOUTHERN side, and 4 on NORTH side of track, WEST of the en, giving fire support.
- e. Once deployed on the SOUTHERN side, the sect was to "pepper pot" forward, with covering fire being given from the pl conds group of four. The man at 'K' threw a grenade which hit a tree and bounced back, it exploded approx 6 yds from two men near 'K'. There was NO effect to either en or our forces, due to the slope of the ground. As the SOUTHERN group "pepper potted" forward, the man at 'K', Pte RICHARDS, the first to reach the crest, was shot, and fell back down the slope. Pte G.A. JOHNSON, a stretcher bearer, immediately administered first aid. At this stage, because of the risk of further casualties, if the attack was pressed from this flank, the pl cond ordered the group at 'K', to give covering fire, whilst the pl cond's group moved forward. After approx 3-5 yards crawling forward against effective fire, from an enemy, previously indicated at 'C', the pl cond's group were forced to stop. This man was later seen to have an AR 15.
- f. Two courses were now possible, a deep right or left hook, in dead ground past the en, or call on 2Lt CHAMBERS group, who were at GR 939582, to hit the en from the rear. This group consisted of, 2 Lt CHAMBERS, signaller, stretcher bearer (Pte T. YOUNG) plus two sects. One sect was already moving about 2 mins ahead of 2Lt CHAMBERS. 2Lt CHAMBERS was called forward to assist.
- g. During 2Lt CHAMBERS movement WEST along the ridge, Lt CURTIS & 4 men moved to join the group between 'J' and 'K' to allow a sect to move through on the NORTH side of the track. During this movement, the headset of the radio, was ripped off the set, rendering the set useless. Cpl LANE (7 sect 9pl) with his sect, moved WEST along the NORTH slope of the ridge, approx 20 yards NORTH of the en. Approx 20 yards NW of the buttress tree, Lt CURTIS saw Cpl LANG had gone past the two en, and was in view of the en at 'C'. The pl cond and Pte ANDERSON shouted to Cpl LANG to get down behind cover, as there were en behind the buttress tree, but at this stage Cpl LANG was shot. Pte T. YOUNG, the stretcher bearer, raced forward, pulled Cpl LANG from danger, and dressed his wounds. Lt CURTIS called to 2Lt CHAMBERS, indicating where the en were. 2Lt CHAMBERS plus a sect (3 sect 7pl) then closed onto the two en. The en at 'B' turned round and fired into 3 sect. The en on the NORTH, attempted to turn round, but was shot during this attempted movement. This movement was slow, forced, but determined, probably because this man had been previously wounded from rounds fired through the buttress tree. The fourth man could not be seen by this group on the NORTH of the track. Pte LAVERTY, moving on the SOUTH side of the track, saw the fourth man at about the same time as he was seen. The en then pointed his weapon towards Pte LAVERTY, however, LAVERTY fired first, killing the fourth en. There was only a matter of seconds between the 3rd and 4th en being shot.



5. To illuminate the pad, C Coy used a circle of hexamine fires in mugs, and moss tins. The pilots reported that this was very effective. It may be worth while to publisize this method.
6. I feel we should pay tribute to a very brave enemy. The last two enemy could have escaped after the first contact. They chose to stay and fight to the last. One of these men is now thought to be an officer.

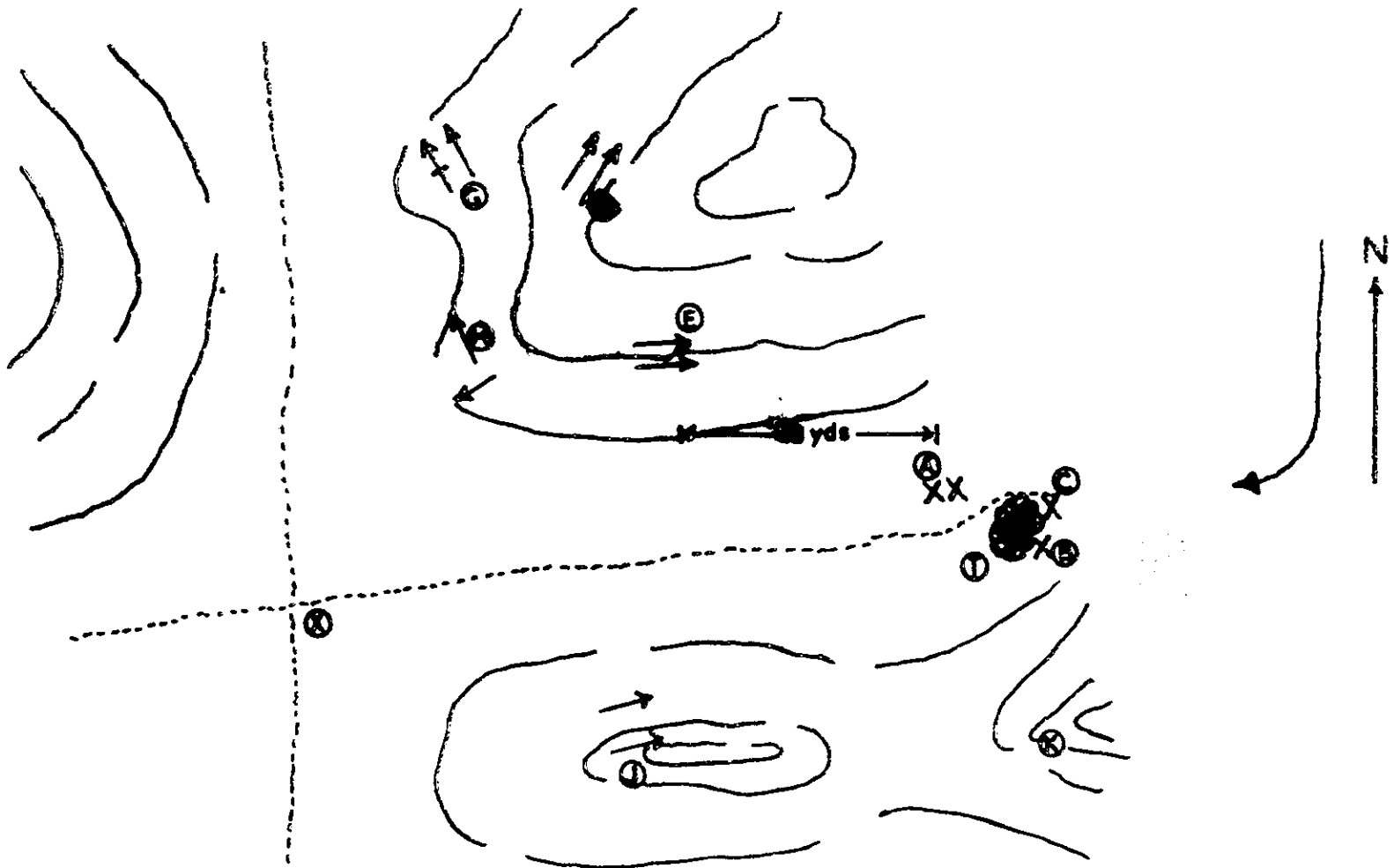

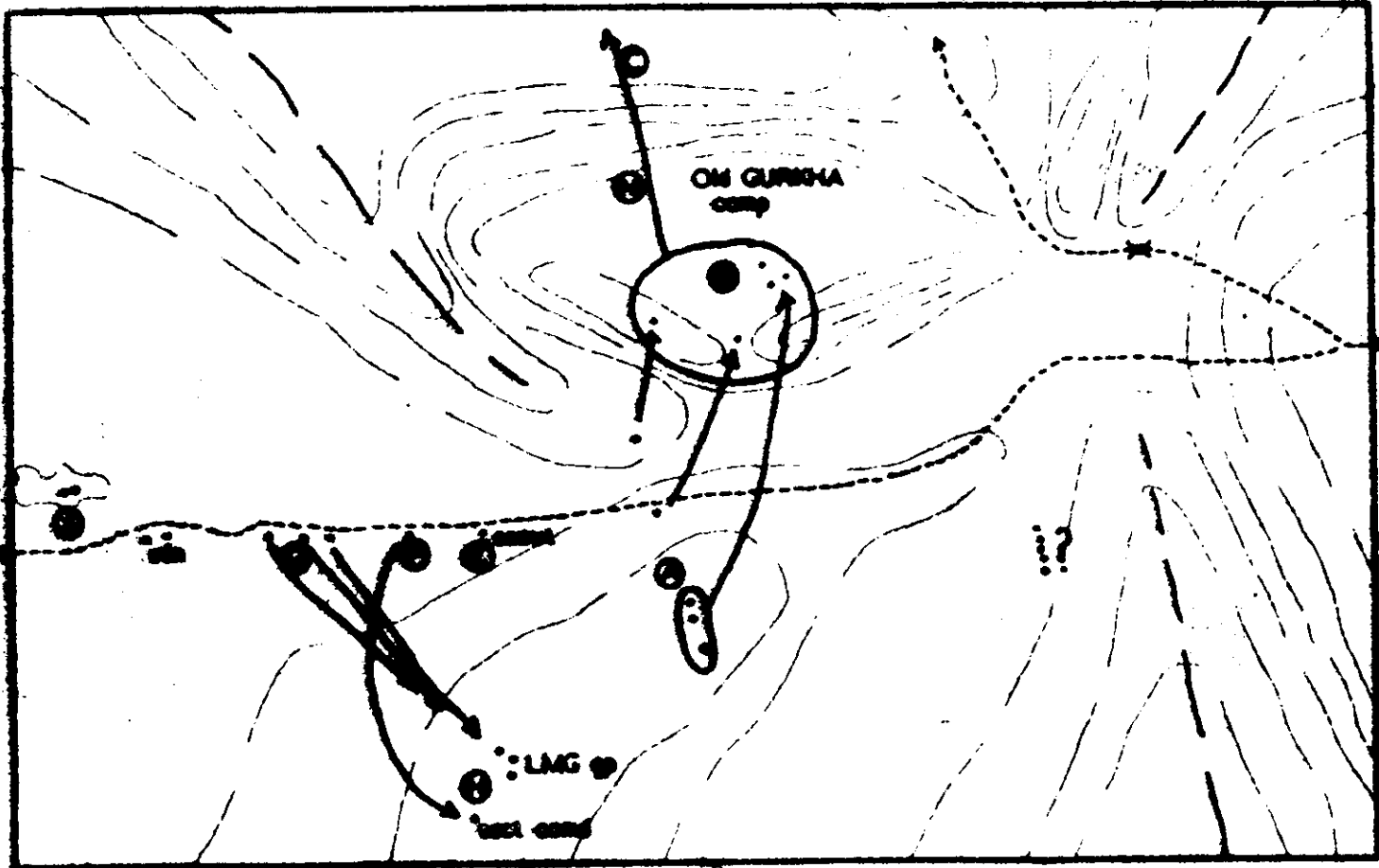

 13. Description of contact:
 - a. Tracks had been located by the tracker team at 066605 at 0730 hrs on 14 Jun 66. The tracks being followed were approximately 24 hours old. The estimated strength of the enemy party was initially five. Some members of the tracker team claimed that there may have been more than five, but because agreement could not be reached, "tracks for five" were continued to be reported. The tracks were followed WEST along the RAYA ridge to G. UINDAN 990597, where the tracks were washed out. At this stage the tracks were still heading WEST, and 24 hours old. Subsequent investigation reveals there was almost certainly ten men, moving in two groups of five.
 - b. At 0810 hrs, 15 Jun 66, Lt D.R. BYERS dispatched a section to patrol EAST for 200 yards from 956587. Their task was to investigate suspected noise from the site of the previous night's ambush, which was withdrawn at 0700 hours. At 0817 hrs, a large volume of fire was heard from the area of 958587.
 - c. Ref Annex 'P'. Cpl FIELDS section were at 'J', with the forward scout just short of 'E'. At this stage, noise was heard from 'A', and the LMG group were ordered to move onto the high ground at 'H'. During this movement, the forward scout (now at 'E') and the first enemy, simultaneously saw each other. The forward scout opened fire and thought he saw the enemy slide to the ground. Fire was then brought to bear onto the LMG group approaching 'H', pinning the LMG group a few yards short of 'H'. Whenever the LMG number one changed a magazine, he drew a burst of fire.
 - d. The first two enemy were now returning the fire, pinning the forward scout ('E') and sect cond ('F'). The rifle group at the rear of the sect cond moved back into a good fire position in a rocky outcrop at 'J'. The enemy then used fire and movement to reach area 'B'. However, whilst the enemy were moving to 'B' fire was also received from 'D'. The exact location of 'D' is not known, but it appeared that now there were more than five enemy as originally thought. The fire was certainly coming from the high ground to the EAST. From the weight and sound of this fire, it is thought there was an LMG in this group.

Due to previous knowledge gained during a recce on 14 Jun, Lt BYERS realised that the enemy had withdrawn to an old SF camp situated at 'B'. This camp completely dominated the area of the contact. The CENTRE, LEFT and RIGHT approaches were not feasible unless heavy casualties were to be accepted. The CENTRE and LEFT approaches were not feasible because of the enemy fire being brought down. The RIGHT approach required a single file approach up a 40 foot escarpment. The vegetation was thick secondary jungle, making concealed movement very difficult. The REAR approach was discounted at this stage as it would have taken too long. Therefore artillery fire was called down.
- f. The artillery fire proved ineffective as the target area was a virtual pin point. The ground fell away steeply on the NORTH, WEST and EAST. To enable correct ranging it would have been necessary to pull back our own troops because of safety. This was not done as contact would have been broken, allowing the enemy to withdraw.
- g. Lt BYERS then suspended the artillery fire and moved with the reserve section from 'J' to do a deep RIGHT hook to the rear of the enemy. They swept through the enemy position from EAST to WEST, but the enemy had previously withdrawn. The time now was approximately 1020 hours.
- h. The IBAN tracker was called forward and found tracks for 5 men moving NORTH.
- j. The platoon was concentrated which took a considerable time as one section was at helipad RED 552 waiting for new recruits.

14. Details of immediate follow up:

- a. At 1150 hours, the platoon moved off. The tracks were followed NORTH, NW, WEST and SW. At one stage, the enemy tracks passed between the top of the ridge at 940581 and helipad at 938584. At 1740 hours, a large volume of fire was heard from the direction of 9 platoons section ambush at 934578. At this stage, 8 platoon was approximately 800 yards behind the enemy. Connect with Engagement Report No 2.
- b. 8 Platoon was not actively engaged in this second contact, but assisted in evacuation of our own two casualties.

15. Lessons Learned or Relearned:

- a. This was a well trained, well lead, well disciplined and very well equipped enemy. They should not be underestimated.
- b. The old lesson that good information is vital to operations of this nature was again demonstrated.
- c. A Border Scout first reported the tracks of this party at 1600 hrs 14 Jun 66. This and other incidents have demonstrated the value of an alert and loyal body of Border Scouts.

16. CO's Comments:

- a. Cpl FIELD and his six men did well. All their actions were consistent with their training. After the engagement they were upset that they had not been able to deal with a party of five enemy. It is now apparent that the enemy strength was ten or eleven. The enemy had the best tactical ground and fought very well. The enemy were well concealed and any movement by Cpl FIELD's section drew heavy fire.
- b. It appears that the enemy may have withdrawn either during the artillery fire or during the RIGHT hook by Lt BYERS. Because of the ground their withdrawal was not seen by our troops.
- c. This and the subsequent engagement confirm that the enemy was well trained, well led and well equipped. They should not be underestimated.
- d. The IBAN tracker CHENDAN attached to this platoon deserves special commendation. He found the tracks on which the enemy party had withdrawn NORTH very quickly. The subsequent follow up produced information which allowed troops to be positioned to cut off the enemy. Of this party, four were eventually killed.
- e. No follow up was made of the other half of the enemy party of ten or eleven, as it was not realised until the debrief on the following day that there were in fact ten or eleven enemy. This party has not been located and it is thought they have recrossed the border into INDONESIA.
- f. On 15 Jun 65, Lt BYERS took part in an engagement in the BAU District, for which he was awarded the MC. His next engagement was exactly a year later to the day.

ADDENDUM

Since writing above comments, information has been received that there were ten or eleven enemy involved in this contact. Two were wounded, one thought to be in the hip and one in the wrist. A party of six including the wounded escaped from the contact. It is believed that this party has now returned to INDONESIA. This information makes the performance of Cpl FIELD's section even more commendable. His section of seven engaged eleven enemy and wounded two without casualties to themselves.

General

1. Confirmation has been received that the enemy have evacuated KINDAU
2. There are reports of 514 Brawijaya bn moving forward SE from SELUAS.
3. Reports have been received to indicate Sriwijaya troops are moving towards SONGKONG, previously unoccupied by TNI. since early 1965.
4. Arty has been located in the RISAU area.
5. HADJI-POERI
B2. Siliwangi troops are occupying a position at HADJI (763546) in approx pl strength. These troops do patrol from HADJI.
6. B3. 20 May. Med and light mors were fired from a baseplate posn in the POERI area (7852). Impact area thought to be 2-3000 yards SOUTH of POERI.
7. Comment Although the enemy appears to have given up the line of the Sg Separan, it appears there is still a company in the area HADJI-POERI, presumably to protect this L of C.
8. KINDAU
B3. Civilians are now rebuilding their houses which were evacuated when the TNI arrived many months ago. All the troops have now left KINDAU and moved to SEDJARAU.

SELUAS-RISAU-BABANG-KINDAU

9. B3 Regular patrolling now takes place. The troops mainly come from SELUAS but occasionally from RISAU. Troops who patrol are Rangers, LUMP PGRS, and PIKR(?) Patrols are usually 30 strong. Routes are unknown. In some cases, returning patrols hand over to fresh patrols at the 'new camp' between KINDAU and BELIPA. The patrols normally last three to four days.
10. B2 24 May. Enemy of approx sec (plus) strength were reported to be at HASKERTAS (855530). No other details were available.
11. Comment It appears that although the enemy have given up the line of the Sg Separan, EAST of POERI (7852) to KAIK (904524), isolated patrolling to the HASKERTAS area still continues. As yet, there is no evidence to indicate any of these positions have been re-occupied.

Brawidjaja Liaison and Ranger Patrolling to G. JAGOI and SERIKIN track.

- I2 F6. 27 May. A small patrol had moved along the track BABANG-SERIKIN and at the border placed a symbol in the centre of the track. Source had heard a similar symbol had been placed on POKO PAYONG (comment: G.JAGOI)
- I3 C3 About the 28 May, Rangers had patrolled to the border and put a 5ft pole, in the centre of the BABANG-SERIKIN track.
- I4 Comment A pole was reported to have been seen by traders on 27 Jun. Why it was placed there is unknown. It may have been a guide to navigation, particularly at night. So far, it has served no apparent useful purpose. The border was checked, so if is a symbol, it is WEST of the border.
- I5 F3 The military visitors that were expected at BABANG arrived on 21 May and stayed overnight. A Brawidjaja officer, referred to as 'Colonel', and ten Brawidjaja soldiers were reported to have been in the party. The Colonel was accompanied by Capt SUTOYO from SELUAS.
- I6 Comment This may have been a routine visit. However there may be some connection between the visit and the placing of poles on likely incursion routes, one of which has been used in the past.

Movement restriction of civilians between SERIKIN and BABANG.

- I7 B3 In reply to a request by source to attend the DYAK festivities in BABANG, Sgt SUKATMO (SEKSI) wrote a letter which stated (extracts only) "I beg you (sources name) not to come to BABANG because of military affairs. Trading is next allowed on 10 Jun 'for the same reason'
- I8 Comment Last year, source had been permitted to attend the festivities and freely mix with the TNI. No trading was done from the 28 May until 6 Jun, when a party from the KINPAU-BELIDA area arrived. From the time that they arrived (early morning), it is suspected that they did not report into BABANG. The normal procedure appears to be that, trading parties assemble at BABANG, and under supervision, leave the BABANG area.

ARMY

- I9 B3 17 May. Civilians travelling to SELUAS passed approx 30 ARMED troops carrying guns towards RISAU. They were seen approx one mile from RISAU. Sub-source claims to have seen eight wheels and two barrels. The wheels were approx the same size as a car, and had rubber tyres. The barrels were 15 feet long.
- I20 F6 Previously there were four guns at SELUAS. On 25 May, civilians from BABANG helped troops to carry one of those guns to RISAU. Sub-source claims two pers carried the barrel, and four pers carried two wheels. RISAU camp had been occupied by 30-40 armed troops.
- I21 F6 On 28 May, 8 launches from SAMBAS arrived at SELUAS with rations and ammo.
- I22 F3 28 May. Previously there were four guns at SELUAS, then four more arrived. On approx 14 May, two of these guns were moved to RISAU by the TNI. Sub-source claims he had heard the two guns were to be positioned near the end of the G. BRUNEI.

- 23 B3 25 May. Three large guns were already in position at the junction of the RISAU-SELUAS track with the track to SEEDJARAU (approx Grid square 8846). Sub-source claims it took eight men to carry one barrel. The guns did not have muzzle breaks. Gun positions were not completed as at 25 May.
- 24 C3 6 Jun. Source has heard there are now two AA guns with long barrels, at SELUAS. The diameter of the barrels was approx 3 inches.

25 Comment.

The report of a barrel 15 foot long appears to be exaggeration. These may be some type of AA gun. ... possibly at RISAU. Further info if required.

- 26 B2 On night 4/5 Jun, approx 20 rounds were fired from the area of RISAU between 041805 hrs and 050345 hrs. The gun fired on seven separate occasions. Bearings from three locations placed the gun in the general area of 930150, with the impact area approx 1500 yards WEST of the border between the 42 and 47 NORTHINGS. All rounds landed inside INDONESIA.

27 Comment

These reports are confusing. It appears:

- a. There is at least one gun at RISAU. There may be two.
- b. These are probably 76mm; but there is a possibility they may be 105mm how.

Troop movement South East from SELUAS

- 28 C3 a. 14 May. 143 troops moved by boat from SELUAS to BOMBONG.
- b. 15 May. 146 troops went by launch to TADAN, then by foot to BOMBONG. Supplies, including Mor and SA ammo were also transported by small boats to TADAN and then carried forward. The troops were quartered in the houses of AH KUAN AHAK, DAGANG, PAN MOO, NYULIN, PALAM and the school BA LI, BAKI. The Supplies were also stored in the same locations.
- c. 25 May. Source counted 163 men leaving BOMBONG in the direction of SEBOENJIT. Three OPR (NYULIN, APIN & MUKIT) moved with the troops. These troops carried two Ho 8 Mors (60mm), 16 boxes of Ho 8 bombs, and 16 Ho 2 Mors with 20 boxes of bombs.
- d. 26 May. 100 troops from SEBOENJIT patrolled to SINGING, and were supposed to return to SINGING on 31 May.
- e. 28 May. Source assesses there are still 230 troops at BOMBONG.

29 Comment

Connect INTREP of 29 May (not to all addressees). It is thought the enemy have re-occupied SEBOENJIT in coy strength. The report of 100 troops patrolling to SINGING is confusing. This is much larger than their normal patrol. It is possible that SINGING may have been re-occupied.

SRINIJAYA

- 30 C3 26 May (date not certain). 162 troops left BOMBOENG for SONGKONG, taking with them one OPR. They carried 16 2inch Mors, and 20 bombs. The troops stated they were going to SONGKONG to prepare their location and try to construct a heli-pad. The highest ranking officer seen in this group was a 2Lt.
- 31 C3 24 May. (different source to para. 30) 100 troops left BOMBOENG for SONGKONG. Source claims that they were Sriwijaya. The task of the troops was to prepare heli-pad at SONGKONG. There were 40 Sriwijaya left at BOMBOENG. The highest ranking officer seen was a Major.

32 Comment

Connect INTREF of 29 May (not to all addressees). The wings similar to para wings outlined in green maybe Sriwijaya and NOT Brawidjaja. Source had just completed one month living with on IDT at SONGKONG, who talked freely. Also a recent F3 report was received which stated that a 'large number' of infantry troops wearing Swiwijaya flashes were seen in PONTIANAK in Feb. SONGKONG is a known PRGS base. There have been no TNI in this area since early 1965. The reported re-occupation of this position is significant. There are two possibilities; either the TNI intended to join up with the PRGS or they were sent there to establish control over the PRGS.

PGRS-SRIJAYA

- 33 B3 22 May. 100 (approx) PGRS arrived. Sub-source claims that PGRS have already been sent to the border areas of LUNDU and GUMBANG.

34 Comment

No recent reports have been received to indicate PGRS movement immediately opposite GUMBANG. The only other PGRS that have been reported, are three that live at BOMBOENG.

- 35 F3 28 May. Sub-source claims that if the peace talks fail, PGRS are ready for an attack over the border, supported by arty.

36 Comment

It is not thought the PGRS would make an incursion without some of the party being TNI. The PGRS would have a better chance of success if they waited until SF left the area (if this happens). The claim that an attack would be backed by arty appears reasonable.

KAPOET

- 37 F3 7 Jun. There are no troops at KAPOET.

THKU

- 38 C3 2 Jun. A Malay, wearing OG's THKU flashes, armed with a Thompson, arrived in BOMBOENG. He was accompanied by three persons dressed in civilians clothes. The party had come from BENGKALANG (I:250,000 - 4090) The Malay was described as about 50 years old white hair with a receding hair line. The Malay is known by the name 'BAUD'

39 Comment

Connect with Interrogation Report (Bde only) Int/G/3037. This description agrees with the description of BAUD bin Ismail, a senior official of the THKU.

183. SAFETY - DANGEROUS GOODS IN AIRCRAFT

1. The carriage of the following goods is prohibited in all RAF Transport and civil aircraft:

Compressed gas containers (Butane, Propane etc); Aerosol containers; All Firearms (except for certain weapons subject to special conditions); Explosives and Inflammables; Mercury; Potassium Chlorate (Chlorate of Potash).

2. When any doubt exists as to the safety of any other article for carriage by air it must be declared to the movements or airline authority. Batteries must be removed from Electronic equipment (including transistor radios) and hearing aids are to be declared to the aircraft crew before take off.

3. Further details are contained in DCI 13/66, and individuals are to be fully conversant with the regulations before proceeding on a journey by air.

184. SECURITY ON THE TELEPHONE

1. Attention has been drawn to the lack of security in the use of the Post and Telegraph telephone and radio relay system.

2. An enormous amount of valuable intelligence was gathered recently by a monitoring team in a very short period.

3. People using the P & T telephone system must realise that:

a. Telephones are NOT secure. All long distance calls are radio relay and can be intercepted with ease and conversations can be picked up by commercial radio sets. Calls on landline can be tapped.

b. Even the Secrophone is NOT secure.

c. Many breaches would be avoided if greater use was made of address groups, appointments codes and codewords for places and features.

4. There will be further monitoring of communications in the future and a considerable improvement is expected.

192. SECURITY

1. Personal Mail

Cases have occurred where personal mail has been redirected through INDONESIA. All ranks are to be warned of the danger of this happening and that personal letters are not to contain any information classified RESTRICTED or above.

2. Intelligence Collectors

Civilians have written to units and individuals asking for the names of unit personalities, BFPO stamps, unit locations and forthcoming moves. Such letters are not to be answered and are to be forwarded to HQ WEST Bde by the unit concerned.

3. Laundry Bundles

Care is to be taken to ensure that the pockets of articles sent to the laundry are empty. Cases have occurred where identity cards and discs, pay books and even rounds of ammunition have been found in personal laundry bundles. Disciplinary action should be taken against the personnel leaving such items in clothing sent to the laundry.

4. Photography

Cases have occurred where photographs have been taken by soldiers of military installations and equipment. Negatives of these films have disappeared and extra prints have been made which have not been returned to the film's owner. All ranks are to be warned that it is an offence against the Official Secrets Act to take photographs which may be of use to the enemy, and also that no studio or photographer in the area can be considered secure.

5. Approaches to Military Personnel

Approaches have been made to personnel with the intention of obtaining military information. All ranks are to be warned of the dangers of this and of talking about classified matters to persons who do not have the need to know such information. Any incidents of this nature are to be reported by the unit to HQ WEST Bde.

6. Classified Documents

Due to the difficulties of housing and accounting for classified documents in this theatre, classified document holdings are to be kept to a minimum. Documents are to be regularly checked and those no longer required destroyed.


