

SECURITY - TERENDAK GARRISON

1. A lack of security awareness has gradually developed within 28 COMWEL Bde since the ending of confrontation. Specific instances have indicated a lack of co-operation and an irresponsible attitude among both soldiers and families.
2. The Brigade Intelligence and Security Unit have been ordered to increase their vigilance on all matters affecting security within the Garrison. 1. The Trustees of the AMF Relief Trust Fund have recently agreed to the provision of loans to families resident in Australia of members serving overseas.
2. Assistance may be granted without formal application by members who, however, are required to signify their consent to the loan in writing, and agree to repayment by means of allotments through the paybook.
3. Loans will be made to assist families in financial difficulty who require urgent assistance in connection with debts due to failure to maintain hire purchase commitments etc or to some unforeseen domestic expenditure. All applications submitted on behalf of families are subject to command investigation and recommendation.

126. WELFARE - HOME SAVINGS GRANT SCHEMES

1. The Commonwealth Government is offering married persons aged less than 36 years a grant of \$A2 for every \$A6 saved for the first home they own. The savings must be made over a period, and held in an approved form. The maximum grant to a married couple, or a husband or wife if only one is eligible, is \$A500 on savings of \$A1500 or more. Smaller grants are, however, payable on lesser amounts saved.
2. The grant is a tax-free gift, it is not a loan.
3. The aim of the Scheme is to encourage young people to save, both before and after they are married, for the first home they own after marriage. The grant is a reward for this saving, and will assist young people to own and establish a home.

2. MISSION

g. Baggage

- (3) 10 lbs of toilet articles or on flight requisites may be carried by each seated passenger as IN CABIN baggage. Containers of such luggage must not be larger than normal airlines overnight bag, and any one container must not exceed 10lbs. This baggage is included and not additional to baggage allowance.
- (4) Baggage must be suitcases, kitbags or similar containers. Metal trunks or packing cases will not be accepted for carriage by air.
- (5) Each piece of luggage must have 2 labels marked as follows:
 - (a) Baggage for movement Singapore/Brisbane:
Label 1 - to show No; Rank; Name and Unit.
Label 2 - GREEN for Brisbane.

 - (c) Coloured labels as appropriate will be distributed to sub units by Thu 23 Mar 67.


