#### GENERAL

- 2. Entries will be made daily on AF C2118, each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
- 3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties in the Field". Chapter 2, Section 7.

#### RESPONSIBILITY

#### **During Non-operational Periods**

4. A Commanders Diary will be made by commanders of all formations.

#### During Operational Periods (see note 1)

- 5. A Commanders Diary will be made in duplicate by:-
  - (a) Commanders of all formations.
  - (b) Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a Brigadier or above.
  - (c) Heads of services not below the rank of Lieutenant Colonel.
  - (d) Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
  - (e) Unit commanders.
  - (f) Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

#### **COMPILATION**

- 6. Both original and duplicate copies will consist of:
  - (a) Cover (AF C2119).
  - (b) Index as printed on cover.
  - (c) Narrative (AF C2118).
  - (d) Annexes as shown in the Index.
- 7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes will be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer will be included.
- 8. The annexes will be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an Annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, the relevant papers should be grouped as annexes starting at B.
- 9. Documents concerned with future planning for operations will form Annex "Z", "TOP SECRET Supplementary Diary" of the fermation originating the document. It will be prepared and disposed of as

#### 226. CUSTOMS CONCESSIONS

Reference: "Guide to Customs for Passengers to Australia".

- 1. In addition to the general concessions outlined in the reference, there are additional concessions available to members of the Australian Defence Force on special service overseas in accordance with the provisions of the Repatration (Special Overseas Services) Act 1962-65 or on service in the British Commonwealth Strategic Reserve Area.
  - a. Goods sent to Australia. Customs duty and sales tax and not payable on the following goods sent to Aust:-
    - (a) Souvenirs, Gifts and Other Goods (but not tobacco products and spirituous liquor) up to a total value of \$A50 in any calendar year provided that such goods are not intended for sale, exchange or trade; and
    - (2) Tobacco Productions in addition to the goods to the value of \$450 admitted free of duty mentioned in (1) above up to -

2.000 cigarettes. or

- 5 lbs tobacco, or
- 5 lbs cigars (about 400 medium size)

in any calendar year.

(3) Declaration. It is essential for Customs purposes for all parcels forwarded to Australia by servicemen abroad to terms of this concession, to be accompanied by a Declaration. Failure to comply with this requirement will result in the addressee being charged duty on goods which would otherwise be free. Declaration forms should be held by all units and made available to members as required. Any units requiring these declarations should submit demands direct to HQ AAF FARELF.

# b. Goods Brought in by Servicemen Returning to Australia

- (1) Souvenirs, Gifts and other goods (but not tobacco products and spirituous liquor) up to a total value of \$A50 provided that this concession has not been allowed during the current calendar year in respect of goods sent to or brought to Australia from abroad and the goods are not intended for sale, exchange or trade; and
- (2) Tobacco products in addition to the quantity of tobacco products allowed admission free of duty mentioned in para 1 a. above up to:

200 cigarettes, or

1 lb tobacco, or

1 lb cigars (about 40 medium size)

for each week of leave but not exceeding a total of:

2,000 cigarettes, or

5 lbs tobacco, or

5 lbs cigars (about 400 medium size)

(3) <u>Declaration</u>. In the case of eligible servicemen returning to Australia it is necessary for the normal passengers Baggage Declaration to be completed. In addition the following declaration, which should be stamped or written on or fixed to Passengers Baggage Declaration Form, must be completed in order that the special concessions relating to souvenirs, gifts and other goods may be obtained:-

I,..... hereby declare that: (NAME IN BLOCK)

(a) I am a member of the Australian Defence Force on special service in accordance with the Repatriation (Special Overseas Service) Act 1962-65

I am on service in the British Commonwealth Strategic Reserve Area.

\*Delete where not applicable.

2. The concessions set out above are not available to Couriers.

Service Attaches or Service Representatives serving at High Commission or Embassies or Servicemens wives or members of their families living abroad. These persons are, however, on return to Australia entitled to the concessions outlined in the reference.

# Furniture and Household Goods

- 3. A passengers furniture and household goods (to a specified value) are admitted free of duty and sales tax, provided such goods have been owned and used by the passenger for at least one year before the passengers departure for Australia. (See reference).
  - b. Application from members of the Australian Defence Force for reduction of the one year period referred to, will be considered by the Department of Custons and Excise on the individual circumstances of each case.

# 227. PULHCEMS ASSESSMENT AND ALLOCATION OF PES

- 1. From a check by CARO it is revealed that approximately fifty percent of records do not show a members' PES. This is causing unwarranted embarrassment and confusion in postings.
- 2. The PULIEEMS Administrative Pamphlet 1965, issued with ARO issue No 130 of 22 Jan 65, lays down the procedures to be followed for:
  - a. Allocation of PULHEEMS assessment.
  - b. Allocation of PES.
  - c. Notification of both to CARO.
- 3. As an initial step to correct the situation described in paragraph 1 above, sub units are to take the following action:
  - a. Check F Med 4s and F Med is to determine whether or not PULHELMS assessment and a PES have been recorded.
  - b. Check whether or not unit copies of AAFsD20 are held showing PES, with CARO on distribution list.
  - c. If a PES is recorded on F Med 4 or F Med 1, but no AAF D2O is held or if CARO is not included on distribution list, the sub unit is to:-
    - Prepare AAF D20 giving PULHEEMS assessment and PES with date assessed;
    - (2) Distribute copies vide PULHEAMS Administrative Pamphlet, section 13, paragraph 3.
- 4. Action is in hand to ensure those responsible for this subject are familiar with the correct procedures and are following them. Corps training establishments, which are initially responsible for the allocation of PES have been directed to ensure action is taken vide the FULHELMS Administrative Pamphlet section 5 para 3.

# 229. SECURITY - CASUAL HAVESDROPPING

- 1. Concern has been expressed by the Protective Security Committee (FD) over the opportunities that exist for casual eavesdropping within Headquarters and Units.
- 2. In non-airconditioned rooms, windows and doors are frequently left open for ventilation and there are many opengrille mesh portions to walls which are not sound proof. These features constitute a security hazard in as much as contractors' employees, gardeners and other unauthorised persons are given the opportunity of casual eavesdropping.
- 3. The attention of All Ranks should be drawn to the great and continued need for discretion in direct conversation and in speech by telephone.

# 230. DISCIPLINE - SUMMARY PUNISHEEDS IN INTEGRATED UNITS

Reference A - AHQ Admin Instr 6/64 Annex 'F'
B - The Administration of Discipline on War Service
Malaysia (May 1964)

- 1. Australian personnel serving in integrated units or on individual attachments to British units, are subject to the British Army Act 1955. Such members are subject to the same punishments as are British members, without regard to the scale of punishments under Australian Military Law.
- Paragraph 5 a. (4) of reference A above states:

"The punishment awarded to any member of the AMF is not to be more severe than that permitted by Australian Military Law for the same offence."

This refers to courts martial punishments only.

3. Notwithstanding paragraph 1 above, integrated members remain subject to Australian Military Law as well as UK military law as stated in para 7 b. of reference B above.

#### 231. IMPORTATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES BY AUSTRALIAN, SERVICEMEN INTO THE UK

- 1. Advice has been received from the UK HM Customs and Excise that a member of the Australian forces may import a motor vehicle previously owned and used by him prior to his arrival in the United Kingdom free from Revenue charges, within a period of three months from the time of his first arrival to take up his appointment in the UK. The vehicle may not be sold, and must be exported (ie taken out by the member) when he leaves the United Kingdom.
- 2. Under this concession, vehicles will be released free from duty and purchase tax on production at the port of importation of a properly completed form C & E 941A. The form should be completed by the serviceman himself, and should be witnessed by an Officer of the Customs and Excise.
- 3. This concession is now extended to vehs manufactured outside the UK which has been ordered by a serviceman prior to his first arrival to take up duty in the UK but evidence of the order will be required. Moreover, duty-free admission will normally be allowed only if the vohicles are imported within 3 months of the servicemen's first entry although a reasonable extension of this period will be granted in exceptional circumstances. The member who orders the veh should make sure that the veh can be delivered in time ie, within 3 months of his arrival in the UK.

# Sub Unit Fire Officers

# Inspection of Fire Appliances

3. An inspection of fire appliances will be conducted by the Unit Fire Officer on the 26 May 67. Also to accompany the Unit Fire Officer on the Inspection will be the Unit Assistant Fire Officer, Unit Fire NCO (DPRI Sgt) and members from Barrack Stores who can check and make amendments to Inventories and take immediate action on procurement where necessary).

- 1. Members are advised that legal officers are available to assist newbers in the preparation of VILLS.
- 2. Every member who is eligible to do so is advised either to make a valid WILL or satisfy himself that he has already made a valid VILL.
- 3. The advantages of having a valid WILL are:
  - a. It ensures that should the member die, his property will be distributed according to his own wishes and NOT in accordance with the set rules for distribution which apply when a person dies titout a WILL.
  - b. It simplifies the procedure for collecting and distributing property after death so that the persons who benefit generally receive the property sooner and senetimes with less expense to the estate.
  - c. Where only a small amount of property is left, and a valid WILL exists, it is often possible to collect the assets and distribute them without the necessity and expense of a formal application to a court by nerely producing the will to banks, insurance companies, etc.
- 4. Every number over 21 years is entitled to make a valid WILL and, in some states, there are provisions for persons under 21 to make a WILL
  - a. In some states where the member under 21 is on actual nilitary service or has been warned for such service, he may make a valid WILL.
  - b. The term "actual military service" causes some legal difficulties but it is clear that active service in VIETNAM certainly comes within the meaning of "actual military service".
  - c. Where a member who is not otherwise entitled to make a WILL, has been warned for active service in VIETNAM it is desirable that the WILL should state the member's rank, name and unit and then the words having been duly warned on (date) that I am to proceed to VIETNAM on active service hereby revoke all former WILLS and other testamentary dispositions hereto fore made by me".
- 5. Amendments to MBI 212-3 and AMR 1410A and 1410B are in the course of preparation.
- 6. Members in this force may consult (or write to) the DADLS of this headquarters concerning their WILLS. Upon their return to Australia, they can consult solicitors, the Legal Service Aid Bureau or a legal officer.

# 262. TEAPONS SOUVENIRS

- 1. Weapons bought as souvenirs, which includes daggers and knives, if carried unwrapped or worn can be regarded as showing intent to use. This may well result in a civil police charge, it being against the law in SLICAPORE to carry weapons or arms.
- 2. Servicemen should make sure on the purchase of such weapons that they are properly wrapped by the seller and are not unwrapped in a public place.
- 263. DISCIPLING STANDING ORDERS CARRIAGH OF OFFENSIVE MEAPONS OFF DUTY
  - 1. The attention of all sub units is drawn to Malaya Area Special Routine Order 89 of 1964, Section 8, which is re-published Moreunder:

#### "SECTION 8

# CARRIEGO OF OFFENSIVE FLAPONS - OFF DUTY

1. All ranks are reminded that the catrying of offensive weapons off duty in any public place is an offence under the

Prevention of Crime Act, 1953, for which they are liable to be tried by Court Martial. The Act defines an offensive weapon as including anything made or adapted for use for causing injury to the person or intended by the person having it with him for such use by him. Knives, bicycle chains, knuckle dusters etc., all come within the definition of offensive weapons.

- 2. Both in MALAYA and in SIN APOND the local civil laws also prohibit the carrying of offensive we pons, the wording of the local laws being very similar to the wording of the Prevention of Crime Act, 1953.
- 3. Both under the Prevention of Crime Act, 1953, and the local civil laws the omus is in general upon a person found in possession of what appe rs to be an offensive weapon to prove that he has the so-cilled weapon with him for an entirely innocent purpose.
- 4. This standing order will be brought to the notice of all ranks when they first join any unit in the Far East and will also be republished once each quarter in all unit orders."

# 264. WAT IR CONSUMPTION - TER INDAK GAPRISON

# 267. REPORTING OF INCLUENTS

1. Far East Standing Orders Section 65 sub-section II Part XI contains instructions regarding the reporting of two types incidents:

#### MAJOR INCIDENTS

#### 2. These include:

- a. Assaults and affrays between Army personnel on the one hand and civilians on the other.
- b. Incidents in which Army personnel on the one hand and civilians, excluding the energy, on the other are directly involved and where firearms are used.
- c. Serious breaches of Army discipline (eg. collective insubordination, mutiny, or outrage in which Army personnel are involved).
- 3. Action will be taken on the three types of incidents listed at paragraph 2 as follows:
  - a. The senior officer or OR involved in or seeing the incident will report it as soon as possible to the nearest Army unit.
  - b. An Officer or OR to whom an incident is reported by a civilian will report it as soon as possible to the nearest Army Unit.
  - c. The unit to which an incident is reported will, under arangements to be node by the OC, report it as soon as possible to the following authorities.
    - (1) The nearest RMP unit or Detachment (Provost or SIB) by telephone.
    - (2) Civil police concerned, where appropriate by telephone.
    - (3) Brigade or equivalent HQ by telephone.
    - (4) HQ 17 Division/Malaya District, with copies to HQ FARELF and Brigade or equivalent HQ by signal.
  - d. The Brigade or equiv lent HQ to which an incident is reported in accordance with sub-paragraph 3.c. above will report any important subsequent developments, as they occur, to the following authorities:
    - (1) District or equivalent HQ by telephone
    - (2) HQ FARELF, with a copy to District or equivalent HQ by signal.
  - e. The reports on important subsequent developments should include any decision to try an officer or soldier by Court Martial or in a civil court in connection with the incident. The date fixed for trial, with any subsequent alterations in the date and the result of the trial, will also be reported.

#### MINOR INCLUENTS

- 4. COs will report any incident not listed at paragr ph 2 which is likely to result in adverse publicity for the Army. Essential information should reach this HQ before details are published in the press. An example of this kind of incident would be the arrest of a soldier by the civil police on a charge of smuggling.
- 5. COs will also report all cases of soldiers sentenced to imprisonment by civil courts.

6. Reports should be made by Priority signal to HQ FARELF (PSI) and repeated to intermediate form tions.

### PUBLINICAS AND NOTICAS PROCEDURE

7. The report of an incident as required by this Routine Order in no way removes the necessity for taking PUBLINTCAS or NOTICAS procedure as required by Far East Standing Orders Section 53 Pt IV paragraph 27 - 31.

# 268. INDUL TRICT PASSAGE IN RATE AUXCLAFT BUT HEN MALAYSIA AND AUST HILA

- 1. The Australian Department of Air has directed that RA F Hercules aircraft are to be open ted in the freighter role, and that passengers are to be considered as having no priority unless the aircraft have been tasked to carry passengers. In accord with this policy the Officer Commanding RAAF Base Butterworth is personally vested with the responsibility of approving every indulgence passage by RAAF aircraft from Butterworth to Australia.
- 2. The term indulgence as used by the RAAF is not the same as the interpretation used by the British Services. There must be a compassionate reason before an indulgence passize on an RAAF aircraft approved. The OC RAAF Base Butterworth is not permitted to approve travel for passengers who merely wish to take the opportunity of visiting Australia. In addition RAAF personnel are required to purchase a return air fare before being granted an indulgence passage.
- 3. Numerous applications for indulgence air passage have been received in the past from British Service members forwarded direct to MQ RA F Dutsworth. To obviate any unfair allocations of passages between Australian personnel and members of other Commonwealth Services future applications for an air passage to Australia must give detailed reasons for travel, and should only be submitted if compassionate circumstances exist and the unit commander makes a personal favourable recommendation. All applications must be forwarded in the first instance to A Branch Headquarters 17 Division/Malaya District.
- 4. The Australian Department of Air alone is the approving authority for flights from Australia to Malaysia and has advised that with the build-up of Australian Forces in Vietnam/Malaysia, there is very little space available on arcraft travelling from Malaysia to Australia and none on Australia to Malaysia bound aircraft,
  - 5. Officers Commanding who recommend indulgence passage to Australia are to ensure that the personnel concerned are warned of the difficulty of obtaining a return indulgence flight to Malaysia and that they have the fare available.

#### 209. CIVIL DEBTS

HQ AAF RO 76/67 is reproduced below:

- "1. Units receiving letters from HQ AAF FARLAF regarding civil claims requiring action under AMR&O 315A should note:
  - a. AMR & O 315A(1) and (2) relates to instances where a COURT JUDGEMENT (or ORDER) has been obtained.
  - b. A Court order is obtained, either
    - (1) when the parties have actually appeared in court and the court has pronounced judgment in favour of one of the parties, or
    - (2) when one party fails to lodge an appearance in the court office so that the other party is able to obtain a judgment by default.
    - c. Once a court judgment has been obtained by default, it is only rarely that the court will allow the case to be re-opened and disputed in court.
    - d. When such a judgment is obtained against a member AMR&O 315A(1) requires the member to submit a statement as to the action he will take to comply with the court order.
  - e. The stavement when forwarded to this headquarters should contain:-
    - (1) the arrangement by which the sum is to be paid, including the amount of instalments, the regularity of the payments and whether by cheque drawn on a certain bank or by some other means of payment.
    - (2) If no court hearing was held and the debt is denied the reason why an appearance was not entered in accordance with the directions contained in the summons or writ originally served on the member.
    - (3) If no court hearing was held and the claim is denied, a statement as to whether the member will apply for leave to have the judgment set aside as soon as he returns to Australia,

TATTO AND COME OF

- f. Where no court order has been obtained a statement should be forwarded in accordance with AMR&O 315A(2) as to whether the debt is admitted, and, if so, it should contain similar information to that referred to in para 1 (e) (1) above.
- 2. Officers interviewing members in relation to civil debts should follow the above instructions c refully, as vague statements that the debt is admitted without any firm arrangement for payment usually result in further administrative work when no payments are made.

## 210. BAGGAGE RESTRICTIONS ON P&O ORIENT LINES

Reference: Force RO 49/67

- 1. Members wishing to return to Australia by P & O Orient Lines are subject to baggage restrictions not applied by other companies.
- 2. The following is an extract from the P & O information handbook:

"Baggage: Individual packages of baggage must not weigh more than 224 lbs nor measure more than 4 feet in any dimension (excluding polo ssicks, fishing rods, skis, ironing boards, golf clubs or other similar light articles), and should contain only personal effects such as clothing, household linen, cutlery, kitchen utensils, sewing machines, and other similar donestic articles and tools of trade. Wireless, radiograms, television sets, record players etc me suring less than 12 cubic feet may also be shipped as baggage and included in the free allowance.

Radicgrams and television, sets exceeding 12 cubic feet, washing machines, cookers and donestic refrigerators may be shipped with passengers! bag age, but they are not included in the free allowance and are charged at full excess rate, payable on board to the Purser. (Excess baggage is carried at \$M3.43 per cubic foot).

We regret that, with the limited exceptions mentioned above, household effects, furniture, carpets, etc, cannot be accepted as baggage (and therefore cannot be offset against the free allocance); such items must be shipped as cargo, and freight paid thereon.

Packages intended for cabins should not exced 3 ft. in length, 1 ft 9 ins in breadth, and 1 ft 2 ins in height. These dimensions represent approximately 6 cu ft. After embarkation you may send all cases or trunks to the ship's baggage room, where they are readily accessible during the voyage."

- 3. Baggage allowance for service personnel is, adults 80 cubic feet each and children 40 cubic feet each.
- 4. There nombore have barros the size of which precludes its inclusion as ships free allowance it will not be shipped at public expense. Members are responsible for charges raised by P&O for shipping such items. This applies even though a member is within his overall baggage entitlement.

- 2. Carriage and Security of Identity Cards Unless specifically ordered by unit commanders, identity cards are to be carried at all times by Australian Army personnel in FARELF.
- 3. Under no circumstances are holders to allow their identity cards out of their possession, as temporary security for loans or similar services.
- 4. Identity Cards are valuable documents and their possession by unauthorised persons represents a potential security risk. All ranks are expected to take special care to ensure safe custody of their card at all times.
- 5. The loss of identity cards is declared a prevalent offence.
- 6. Recording of Religion on Identity Cards Australian units in this theatre are to record on all AAFs A129 the holder's religious denomination. This should be recorded on the reverse side of the AAF A129 immediately below the words "Australian Hill Forces". In recording the religion, abbreviations are not to be used.
  7. It is essential that the entry should not appear on the front of the AAF A129, which must not bear any alterations or additions.

- 11. Sub units are responsible for ensuring that details of identity cards issued by HQ AAF FARELF are recorded in members! Record of Service Books (AAB 83) when issued.
- 12. Receipts for identity cards, and certificates that entries have been made wide para 11 above, are to be submitted in the form shown at Appendix I to Annex 'A' to this order. A copy of this document will be forwarded to units with each AAF A129 issued, and is to be completed and returned to HQ AAF FARELF within seven days of receipt.

#### Withdrawal

## 232. TRAINING CLEARANCE - JOHORE

- 1. Markas Beriged Ke-Empat Infanteri, Malaysia, Fort Canning, Singapore 6 acts as the military agency, in close co-operation with the Royal Johore Police who give final clearance, in obtaining training clearance throughout Johore. Their aim is to make the most use of the State's facilities as training ground. When units' demands clash with each other or with civil requirements, such as road repair, new roads, geological surveys etc they try to suggest an alternative area or date, or liaison between interested units, formations or services.
- 2. In the past month the pace of training has considerably increased and it is obvious that if as many units as possible are to get the training they want without interference, there must be stricter control. Some of the difficulties experienced are:
  - a. Requests giving less than seven days notice. With delays in the post, signals systems or week-ends this has led to refusal simply because the request could not be cleared with the police, and they with JKR etc in time.
  - b. Units under the same formation asking for the same area at the same time.
  - c. Units asking for a large area, gr nted to then, and then either not using the full area or for the full times or even not intending to use it at all. In a recent case the last was not discovered until two other units had had to be refused clearance.
  - d. In a few cases units:-
    - (1) Carrying out local clearance only. The OCPD will not necessarily know what is in process of being cleared by the Malaysia Mil Auth or by Johore Police.
    - (2) Going into an area without informing anyone. One battalion tried this during a Malaysian Army Brigade exercise in February.
- 3. In the main the system works well and liaison is good. However, with the increased amount of training in Johore unless there is a stricter control, there will inevitably be cases of units deprived of the chance to train as they hope to.
- 4. Sub units are to:
  - a. Impose a stricter control.
  - b. Give particularly early varning, preferably a month, of any exercise of battalion level, requiring a large area to be cleared and so closed to other units for some days. An outline forecast of such training covering the next few months would assist.
