338. GRASS CUTTING - MARRIED QUARTERS

1. The following is the policy regarding grass cutting in married quarters/hirings :
 - a. Grass cutting will be paid for out of public funds for:
 - (i) Quarters located within the boundaries of a Garrison.
 - (ii) Quarters built on MOD (Army) land.
 - b. The areas to be cut include all land, drain, verges, surrounds and rough ground lying adjacent to the qtrs extending up to the lawn/land within the perimeter of each house. The land within the perimeter of a house is entirely the responsibility of the occupant.
 - c. Where no clear division is evident to indicate the lawn/land within the perimeter of the house, this is to be taken as the area of lawn/land immediately adjacent to the house extending to the first natural obstacle such as a monsoon drain or hedge, or to a distance of twenty yards from the house, whichever is the lesser. Where cases of doubt exist the exact perimeter is to be defined by the Depot Officer, MPBW in consultation with MQI.
 - d. The grass land within the perimeter of a house may be cut and paid for out of public funds in cases where the house is left vacant for six weeks or more. In such a cases the cut will normally be made immediately prior to

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the march-in of the new tenant.

2. Sub Coys. This information should be informed to all married families in their sect and brought to the attention of all new families upon arrival.


347. PRIVATELY OWNED VEHICLES

361. SOLDIERS EMPLOYING AMAHS PRIVATELY

1. The attention of all sub unit commanders is drawn to ARO 245/64; particularly paras 4, 6, 7 and Annexure 'A'. A requirement within the terms of entitlement to Married Accompanied rates of Local Overseas Allowance is that where a soldier employs a servant privately he MUST protect himself against claims by his employee for injury arising out of such employment by means of Employers Liability Insurance. Provision for this is included within the rate of Local Overseas Allowance.
2.
 - a. Every married soldier is to sign the following certificate as part of his arrival documentation:

"I certify that when I employ a domestic servant I will take out an Employment Liability Insurance Policy in the terms of para 6 of ARO 245/64".

This certificate is to be preceded by the contents of paras 6 and 7 of ARO 245/64 and is to be witnessed.
 - b. The certificate is to be filed with the soldier's documents.
3. Once a quarter sub units are to call in policies and check that they are current. Where a policy is found to be lapsed (or does not exist) insurance is to be effected forthwith by the soldier or if he fails to do so his allowance stopped as at the date of check.
4. Personnel who have not yet completed certificates required to para 2 above are to do so forthwith.



366. RATIONS

1. D Coy is warned in for rations from 17 to 23 Nov incl.
2. D Coy is warned in for rations on Fri 25 Nov.
3. Sp Coy is warned in for rations from 14 to 21 Nov incl.

367. RELIEF OF OFFICERS FARELF

General

1. The normal tour of duty for officers in FARELF is two years, calculated from the original date of assumption of duty. Unless advice is received to the contrary, all officers may expect to be relieved in their 24th/25th month of FARELF.

Replacement

2. Due to the current shortage of officers in the ARA, delay is often experienced in notification being given as to the name and movement details of nominated replacements. Normally the arrival date of a replacement will determine the actual date the outgoing officer is available for movement, taking into consideration the period of handover required and availability of berths on aircraft/shipping for the southbound journey. Therefore, the RTA date of an officer is often unconfirmed until his replacement has arrived.

Unit Action

3. Immediately advice is received of an officer's new posting, Part I of the attached Annex A will be completed by HQ AAF FARELF and despatched to the unit which is to ensure as much of the form as possible is completed and returned to HQ AAF FARELF. Action will then be completed and signal advice given to the unit as to the actual date an officer is booked to RTA.
4. Attention is drawn to the notes in Annex 'A' attached. Any action contemplated in these matters must be submitted for consideration as early as possible. (AAF RO 104/66).

368. WELFARE

1. The RSL in W Cond has offered to act as agents for Western Australian soldiers who wish to send gifts to relatives and friends for Christmas, birthdays and anniversaries etc.
2. The RSL undertake to purchase any item at a discount, pack and deliver to any address in WA, at no charge other than the cost of the item plus postage or delivery charges.
3. Members who wish to avail themselves of this offer, may write direct to the

30A St Georges' Terrace,
Perth.

Letters should specify the type of gift required, the name and address to which it is to be forwarded, and the amount which may be spent.

4. Payment for such gifts is to be by money order. Members should forward sufficient money to allow the RSL latitude in selecting specific items. Any excess money would then be forwarded with the gift to the recipient.

369. SUPPLY OF PALUDRINE - FAMILIES

(AAF RO 106/66)

1. Paludrine is normally supplied to heads of families under unit arrangements. Stocks are obtainable from the Military Hospital Terendak on demand by Commanding Officers. Simple letter form will suffice.

2. In the event of a head of family being detached or on duty away from Malacca, dependants may obtain supplies from the nearest Families Medical Centre.

3. Families Medical Centre will arrange to indent for and hold stocks accordingly.

370. DISCIPLINE - COMMON HEALTH CLUB

1. The following extracts from Garrison Standing Orders are republished for information and strict compliance:-

a. DRESS

Dress to be worn by male military personnel within the Club is as follows:-

(1) By Day

Either

(a) Slacks, socks and shoes or sandals, or 'flip-flops' without socks, shirt with collar attached or 'T' shirt

or

(b) Shorts, stockings and shoes or sandals, or 'flip-flops' without stockings, shirt with collar attached or 'T' shirt.

(2) By Night (ie After 1900 hrs)

Slacks, socks and shoes, shirt with attached collar, sleeves need not be rolled down and a tie need not be worn, but ends of the shirt must be tucked into the waist of the trousers.

(3) Items of uniform must not be worn with civilian clothing, nor may 'flip-flops' or 'T' shirts be worn after 1900 hrs.

(4) The wearing of swimming apparel is not permitted in the club after 1830 hrs.

b. OPENING HOURS

(1) Daily except Saturdays - 1000 hrs to 2230 hrs
Open for meals and soft drinks.

(2) Saturdays - 1000 hrs to 2400 hrs.

(3) Bar times

- (a) Mon - Fri (incl) . 1200 - 1400 hrs
1800 - 2230 hrs
- (b) Sat - 1200 - 1400 hrs
1900 - 2330 hrs
- (c) Sun/Public Holidays 1200 - 1600 hrs
1900 - 2230 hrs.

(4) Closing

All members and guests must vacate the Club and be clear of it and the immediate area:

- (a) By 2300 hrs - Daily except SATURDAY NIGHT
- (b) By 2400 hrs - SATURDAY/SUNDAY NIGHT

(5) An extension may be authorised in suitable circumstances.

c. CHILDREN

- (1) No child under 11 years of age is allowed on the Club premises or in the pool or immediate area unless accompanied by a parent or other responsible adult.
- (2) No children under the age of 17 years will be allowed in the Club after 1900 hrs.

d. ANIMALS

No animals are allowed in the Club or in the outside area where meals are served. All animals found in the Beach Club will be taken away and destroyed.

e. SWIMMING POOL

- (1) The Swimming Pool will be open from 1000 hrs to 1900 hrs daily, except Monday from 0900 - 1100 hrs when the pool is closed for cleaning and maintenance.
- (2) Rules for the Swimming Pool, which are prominently displayed, must be complied with.
- (3) Parents are to exercise strong control of their children as there are no life savers at the Pool.
- (4) The Club Committee accepts no responsibility for any incident resulting from lack of parental control, over children using the Pool.

f. ADMITTANCE

Members of the public and paid employees with the Garrison are NOT permitted access to the Club or its facilities unless invited and escorted by a member of the Club.

g. ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR

- (1) All alcoholic liquor must be consumed within thirty minutes of bar closing times and all liquor not consumed in this time will be confiscated.

- (2) Bottles of Spirits will not be brought into the Club.
- (3) Bulk buying of beer and liquor is not allowed.
- (4) No child will be served with beer or spirits in any circumstances.
- (5) Members are not to take alcoholic liquor onto the beach or away from the Club premises.

h. DISCIPLINE

- (1) The Duty NCO will order anyone out of the Club who is either misbehaving or not complying with the Club rules.
- (2) The Duty NCO is required to submit a report of any incidents to the Secretary by 0900 hrs on the next working day after his tour of duty.

j. DUTY FREE BEER

- (1) Duty Free Beer will be served to members of the Armed Services or their families ONLY.
- (2) Other personnel using the Club will be required to purchase tax coupons.

372. DISCIPLINE - USE OF WRITTEN STATEMENTS AT SUMMARY HEARINGS

1. Attention is drawn to the note to para 31 g on page 28 of "The Administration of Discipline on War Service in Malaysia", where mention is made of the practice of reading statements during a summary hearing instead of calling witnesses.
2. In such cases, the accused must be asked whether he wishes to cross-examine and if he so wishes, the witness must be called.
3. Where vital witnesses are not available, such a request by the accused may mean that it is difficult to prove a charge without considerable expense in assembling witnesses for the hearing. He must, however, be given the opportunity to cross examine, if he requests it.
4. In serious charges, the location of witnesses between the date of the offence and the hearing should be carefully watched and any possible difficulties in having witnesses available should be reported to the headquarters.
5. It is undesirable that the statements of witnesses forming part of an investigating officer's report be used as evidence as these statements frequently contain inadmissible evidence, eg. hearsay.
6. If it appears to be unavoidable, the statements of witnesses attached to an investigating officer's report may be used but the recommendations and conclusions of the investigating officer should not be used as they are not evidence.
7. Attention is also drawn to para 23 b. (5) on page 21 of "The Administration of Discipline on War Service in Malaysia" which refers to the use

of the words "documentary evidence" in the column of Charge and Defence Reports (AAF A4's), headed "Names of Witnesses". The names of the persons whose written statements are used should be inserted. The word "documentary" is only used in the column for the names of witnesses where part of the evidence is a particular document such as a written order.

373. RETURN TO AUSTRALIA BY SEA

1. The majority of Australian personnel serving in 20 COMMEL Inf Bde are tentatively scheduled to be relieved during the period Sep - Oct 67. Charter Aircraft will be used for this relief.

2. It is essential that the maximum use be made of these aircraft, and, in particular, that the number of seats not filled be kept to a minimum. During this relief, all members and families returning to Australia will be required to move by air. Application for approval to move by sea will be considered only if supported by medical certificates.

3. The period Sep - Oct 67 is tentative and the relief may be brought forward or postponed. If changes do occur, any approvals already granted for movement by sea during the actual periods of the relief will be cancelled.

374. SAFE DRIVING AWARDS

Reference: Standing Orders for Vehicle Operation and Servicing Section 13.

1. The above reference provides for awards to be made to drivers, who complete the prescribed 5,000, 10,000, 20,000, 50,000 and 100,000 miles of accident free driving.

2. There has been little activity in the recommending of drivers for awards in FARELF in the past, and the attention of sub-units is directed to the above reference, with a view to giving safe drivers their due recognition.

General

1. The 4 RAR Christmas Leave period will be from 2400 hrs 11 Dec 66 to 2400 hrs 2 Jan 67 (15 ARL, 3 Sun, 3 Public Holidays).
2. If required, soldiers can be given leave in anticipation of future credits.
3. Coy Comds are authorised to approve leave applications.
4. A rear party on the scale of fifteen per cent of posted strength is to remain on duty in all coys except Admin Coy over the leave period. See paras 11 - 13 below.

Application for leave of absence

5. The allocation of AAF A88 numbers to companies is:

13. Bn HQ will provide the following duties:

14. OC Rear Details - 2Lt DM CHAMBERS is appointed as OC, Rear Details for the leave period - 2Lt DM CHAMBERS will also be the Sp Coy Officer mentioned in para 11.

Duties

15. The Orderly Officer and Orderly Sgt will be responsible to OC Rear Details for the allocation of duties in CAMBERG LINES.

16. All rear party personnel will report to Bn HQ daily at 0800 hrs to the Orderly Officer for the allocation of duties.

17. Duties to be mounted are battalion duties.

18. A duty roster of Orderly Officer and Orderly Sgt is shown at Annex 'A'. Coys are to notify the Asst Adjt NCT later than 5 Dec of those officers and NCOs mounting duties vide Annex 'A'.

Parade States and Rationing

19. Coy orderly rooms are to operate throughout the period to the extent that daily parade states are submitted to Bn HQ.

20. Soldiers returning from leave early for any reason will report to the Bn Orderly Sgt and leave passes will be withdrawn. In such cases the entitlement to living out allowance will be stopped and roll books so marked, that the soldier is shown as on leave; but warned in for rations.

Transport

19. Transport will be operated on a reduced scale. The use of vehicles will be at a minimum. All bids for vehicles with the exception of duty vehicles will be made to the OC Rear Details.

Pay

20. Soldiers going on leave will be paid under coy arrangements on Thu 8 Dec. Coys are to ensure that soldiers NOT going on leave have their paybooks made up for normal pay on Thu 15 Dec before proceeding on leave.

21. OC Rear Details will appoint an officer for pay on Thu 15 Dec, and again on Thu 29 Dec.

Daily Routine Rear Parties

22. Other than the provision of daily battalion duties, soldiers nominated for rear parties will be at the disposal of companies.

23. Daily dismissal parades for Rear Parties from Mon to Fri will be at 1600 hrs unless otherwise ordered by OC Rear Details.

Civil Labour

24. OC Rear Details will represent OC Admin Coy on all aspects of civil labour. OC Admin Coy is to be brief OC Rear Details prior to the leave period commencing.

Security

25. Weapons will be stored separately under QM arrangements. It is hoped that Coy Arms Kotes will NOT be manned during this period other than the Admin Coy Arms Kote for provision of weapons for the battalion quarter guard.

26. Coys are responsible for security of all unattended buildings in their lines.

Medical

27. Coys are to ensure that paludrine is issued to all soldiers proceeding on leave. For those soldiers NOT proceeding on leave paludrine will be issued on the daily muster parade at 0800 hrs.

28. There will only be one medical orderly on duty during the leave period. Urgent medical attention if required is to be the responsibility of the RMO. The RMO is to inform OC Rear Details of the procedure to be followed in cases of emergency treatment prior to Thu 8 Dec.

32. Coy CSMs will parade soldiers NOT proceeding on leave on the Battalion parade ground at 13.45 hrs Fri 9 Dec. The RSM will take over the parade and explain the requirement for the leave period. The Orderly Sgt will attend this parade.



- e. Record all transactions in detail, and retain copies or receipts issued for cash.

ARMOURIES AND MAGAZINES

Reference: HQ 17 GURKHA DIV/MALAYA DISTRICT Security Standing Orders
dated 14 Jun 63

1. With the conclusion of confrontation and the current operational situation the situation in accordance with paras 40 (b), 41 and 44 (b) of the above reference can now be reassessed in relation to Arms Kotes.
2. With effect from receipt of this order:
 - a. A soldier/storeman will always sleep in each sub-unit Arms Kote - this will be the sub-unit's responsibility.
 - b. By day a duty arms kote storeman will always be present within the Kote unless it is locked and secured.
 - c. After dark, when all Arms Kotes will be included in beat of the roving sentry from No 4 Post of the Battalion Quarter Guard, the Arms Kote may, provided it has been locked by the storeman referred to in para (a), be left temporarily unmanned. (This is provided the storeman eventually returns to sleep within the Arms Kote).
 - d. The company Orderly Corporal at the conclusion of training will check the Arms Kote with the Arms Kote day storeman, the night relief and the company Quarter Master Sergeant to ensure all weapons are accounted for.
 - e. The orderly corporal will note in his Log Book the time that this security check has been carried out and the result; he will report the result of such check to the Orderly Sergeant.
 - f. Discrepancies will be immediately reported to the Orderly Officer and the Adjutant. Whilst awaiting direction as to subsequent action an investigation of such discrepancies will be commenced by the Company Commander concerned.
